

## How much time is lost?

Attendance during one school year.	Equals days absent	Which means approximately weeks absent	Which means this number of lessons missed
<b>95%</b>	9 days	2 weeks	45 lessons
90%	19 days	4 weeks	95 lessons
85%	29 days	6 weeks	145 lessons
80%	38 days	8 weeks	190 lessons

Attendance statistics over 6 years of schooling (Reception to Year 5)

85 - 90% = About half a year off school

80% = 38 weeks off school – one whole school year missed.

If your child is **5 minutes late** every day they will **miss 3 days learning each year**.

If your child is **15 minutes late** every day, they will **miss 2** weeks learning each year.

Holidays are not permitted during term time. This are not authorised and will add to pupils' unauthorised absences.

## **Unauthorised Absences**

If a child has **10 unauthorised absences** within a term they are at risk of incurring a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN). This is a fine of £60, which increases to £120 if not paid within 4 weeks.

Why is it important for your

## child not to miss school?

If children do not attend school regularly they may:

- Struggle to keep up with school work.
- Make little progress in their learning.
- Miss out in the school social life.
- Find it difficult to make and maintain friendships.
- Become withdrawn and lack confidence.

Research has shown that children who are not in school are most vulnerable.

What does the law say?

By law, all children of compulsory school age must get a suitable full-time education. Once your child is registered at a school, you are responsible for making sure he or she attends. The Local Authority may take legal action against you.

The school registers are monitored by the School Attendance Officer on a fortnightly basis and has to report any poor attendance to the EWO and the Local Authority. As a parent / guardian you are committing an offence if you fail to make sure that your child attends school.





guardians help?

- Do not take holidays within term time.
- Do not take long weekends which results in your child losing Fridays / Mondays.
- Always tell us where your child is. Let us know straight away through a phone call.
- If you are struggling to and need help let us know.
- Always engage with the school so that we can support you. Sometimes children are ill and they cannot help being absent.
- Always attend attendance meetings if requested. These meetings are meant to be supportive and to ensure that the school is aware of any issues.
