The Saints' Federation School Uniform Policy

It is the schools policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in school-organised events outside normal school hours. We want children to take pride in their school uniform and be proud of it.

Aims and Objectives

Our School Uniform Policy is based on the belief that wearing school uniform:

- helps to create a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
- identifies the children with the school
- supports our commitment to inclusion
- prevents children from wearing 'fashion clothes' that could be distracting in class; and therefore contributes to a good attitude to learning,
- develops self-confidence
- is practical, smart and designed with health and safety in mind
- is considered good value for money by most parents

Pupils at our schools will have an abundant of opportunities to be individuals and we achieve this through the curriculum and out of school activities.

Some items of uniform can be bought from YC Sports, Crwys Road, Cardiff, whilst others are easily available, at very competitive prices, at local shops including supermarkets.

Our school uniform consists of:

	 Black shoes (in the interest of safety, could you ensure that your child wears suitable shoes to school.)

	Black / grey trousers / skirt / pinafore
	White polo shirt
	 Emerald green sweatshirt / cardigan (preferably with school badge)
	Grey / black socks / tights

	 Black shoes (in the interest of safety, could you ensure that your child wears suitable shoes to school.) Please note that skirts and shorts should be an appropriate length so that children can sit comfortably in class including on the floor.

We ask that all items of uniform are clearly labelled with your child's name. This will help to ensure that any items of lost clothing can be returned.

Jewellery, Hair Ornaments, Make-up and Nail Varnish

For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear jewellery. The exceptions to this rule are earring studs in pierced ears, and small objects of religious significance. Children are required to remove any items during PE lessons to prevent them from causing injury. Please note that teachers are not permitted to remove earrings. Hair bands, ribbons/bows or 'scrunchies' should be plain or in school colours. Hair bands should not have large flowers attached. Make up and nail varnish should not be worn to school unless for an out of school hours function, for example a school disco.

The Role of Parents

We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that it is clean, in good repair and that the child's name is written on all items. If a parent has difficulties for any reason with fulfilling this request, they are asked to speak confidentially to a senior member of staff to discuss the issues. Parents should be assured that we will do all we can to help. Children who arrive at school wearing non-school uniform clothing will be loaned an appropriate item from our nearly new shop to wear for that day. The same system will apply for children who do not have a PE kit. Parents will be contacted to discuss the matter. The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are serious reasons, for example on religious grounds, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform, the school will consider such requests sympathetically. If any parent would like to request a modification to the uniform policy they should, in the first instance, contact the Head of School.

The Role of Governors

The Governing Body supports the Executive headteacher and Heads of Schools in implementing the school uniform policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the Governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school uniform policy enables children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hard wearing, safe and practical.
